

- **Where else can I access the plan?**

The Plan has been designed to be accessed and viewed electronically. This helps to provide easy access not only to the Proposed City Development Plan (CDP) but also to all the supporting documents and background papers. All documents can also be viewed and downloaded on the Council's website www.glasgow.gov.uk/developmentplan. Alternatively a paper copy of the Proposed CDP may be inspected, during normal business hours, at the Mitchell Library, all local libraries and at Development and Regeneration Services, 231 George Street, Glasgow.

- **I have received a letter say there is a development near my house. Where can I find more information on the development?**

Neighbour notification letters were sent out to anyone living within the vicinity of a potential housing site that is included in the Proposed City Development Plan (CDP) as is required under Scottish Government Planning legislation. The vast majority of these sites are **potential** development sites and there are no specific details in relation to site layout or design. This detail would form part of any subsequent planning application where there would be further neighbour notification and a further chance for members of the public to comment. Within the Proposed CDP there is a Policy and Proposals map which details, among other things, all the housing sites that will be allocated in the Proposed CDP.

- **How can I make a representation?**

Anyone wishing to make representations on the Proposed CDP, or associated documents, **must do so using the representation form**. The form can be found on the Council's website at: www.glasgow.gov.uk/developmentplan. Representations **must be received by 4pm on Friday 27 June 2014**.

A short guide to making a representation is also available on the website. The form can be submitted electronically or downloaded and returned by email to developmentplan@glasgow.gov.uk. Alternatively, hard copies can be returned to the Development Plan Team, Development and Regeneration Services, Glasgow City Council, 231 George Street, Glasgow, G1 1RX.
