


**GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL BYELAWS
PROHIBITING CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC
LIQUOR IN DESIGNATED PLACES**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 201 and 202 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, the Scottish Ministers hereby confirm the foregoing byelaws.

The Scottish Ministers hereby fix 25 January 2008 as the date on which the byelaws shall come into operation.

**GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL BYELAWS
PROHIBITING CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC
LIQUOR IN DESIGNATED PLACES**

Glasgow City Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of the powers conferred on it by Sections 201, 202 and 203 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, hereby makes the following byelaws:-

INTERPRETATION

- 1 (1) In these byelaws, unless the context otherwise requires:-
"designated place" means any place to which the public have access within the areas specified in Schedule 1 to these byelaws and shown outlined in red on the plan annexed and signed as relative hereto; and
"alcoholic liquor", "licensed canteen", "licensed premises" and "registered club" have the same meaning as in the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1976.

These byelaws shall not apply -

- (a) on 31 December, from 6pm until the end of that day; and
- (b) on 1 January, until 6am.

OFFENCE/

OFFENCE

2. (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3) of this byelaw, any person who consumes alcoholic liquor in a designated place or is found to be in possession of an open container containing alcoholic liquor in a designated place shall be guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 2 on the standard scale.
- (2) It shall not be an offence against these byelaws to do anything in any designated place which is a licensed canteen, licensed premises or a registered club.
- (3) It shall not be an offence against these byelaws to do anything in any designated place in respect of which there is in operation:
 - (a) an occasional licence in terms of Section 33(1) or (2) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 1976; or
 - (b) an occasional permission in terms of Section 34(1) of that Act.during any period when alcoholic liquor may be sold there by virtue of that license or, as the case may be, permission and for 15 minutes after the expiry of such period.

PRESUMPTION AS TO THE CONTENTS OF CONTAINER

3. (1) This byelaw applies for the purposes of any trial for an offence against these byelaws.
- (2) Any liquid found in a container shall, subject to the provisions of this byelaw, be presumed to conform to the description of the liquid on the container.
- (3)

- (3) A container which is found to contain:
- (a) no liquid; or
 - (b) insufficient liquid to permit analysis

shall, subject to the provisions of this byelaw, be presumed to have contained at the time of the alleged offence liquid which conformed to the description of the liquid on the container.

- (4) A person shall not be entitled to lead evidence for the purposes of rebutting a presumption mentioned in paragraphs (2) or (3) above unless, not less than 7 days before the date of the trial, he has given notice to the prosecutor of his intention to do so.

PUBLIC NOTICES OF EFFECT

4. (1) The Council shall erect one or more signs at or reasonably adjacent to each of the designated places for the purposes of giving notice of the effect of these byelaws.
- (2) In proceedings against a person for an offence under these byelaws it shall be no defence that the Council failed to comply with paragraph (1) of this byelaw.

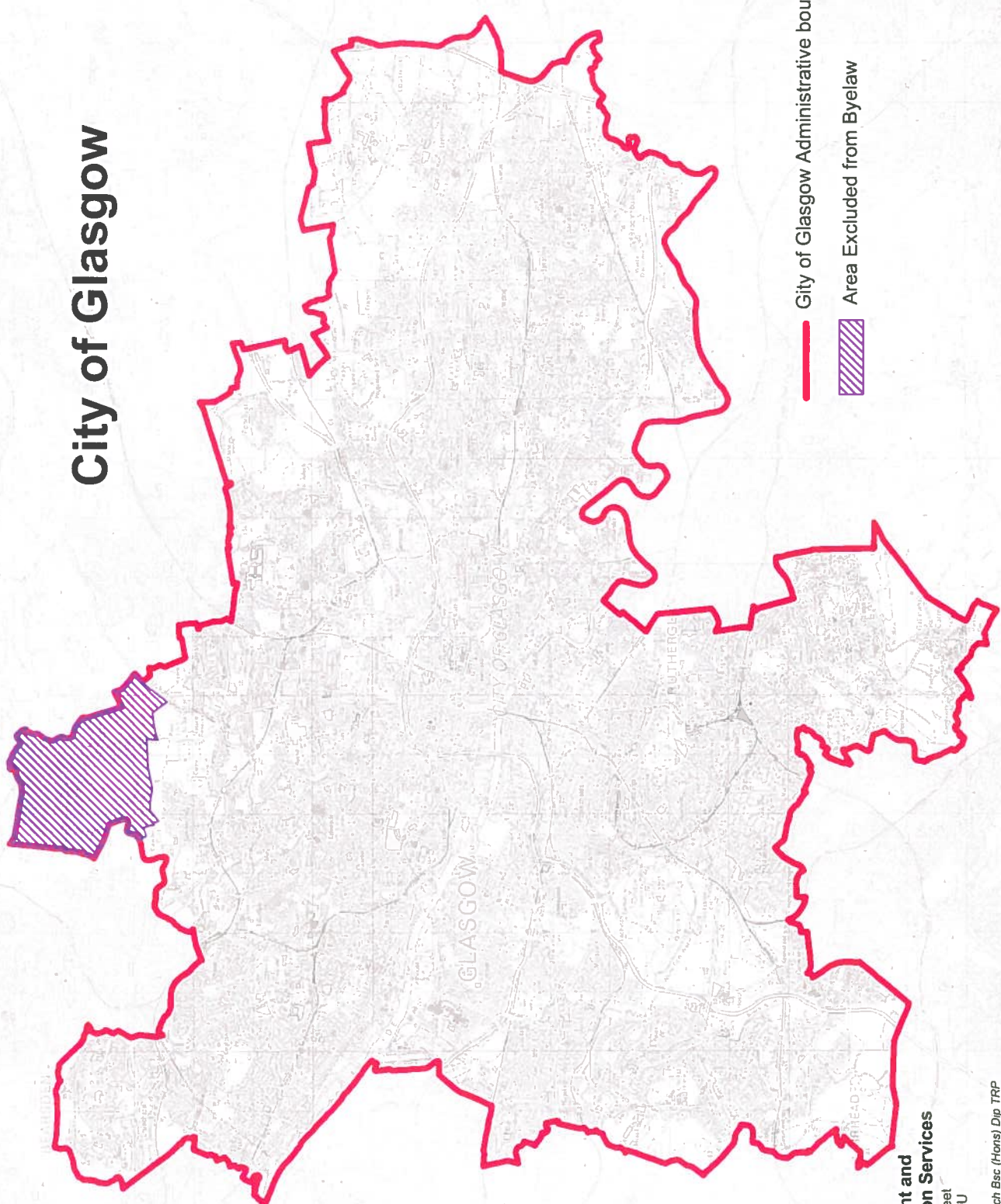

SCHEDULE

DESIGNATED PLACES - THE CITY OF GLASGOW

These Byelaws apply within the Administrative Boundary of the City of Glasgow, as defined in The Local Government etc (Scotland) Act 1994, as amended by The Glasgow City Council and Renfrewshire Council Boundaries (Braehead) Amendment Order 2002, and shown outlined in red on the map annexed to and forming part of these Byelaws, under exception of the area shown hatched in purple on the said map ("the excepted area"), the southern boundary of the excepted area, for the purpose of these Byelaws, shall run south, from the River Kelvin, and east along the west and south boundaries of the field lying to the north of Caldercuilt Farm House, east and southeast along the north and east sides of the unnamed road through Caldercuilt Farm to Blackhill Road, east along the north side of Blackhill Road to Balmore Road, south along the east side of Balmore Road to Lochfauld Road, east and southeast along the north and east sides of Lochfauld Road to the Forth and Clyde Canal and then northeast along the north side of the towing path of the said Canal to the City Boundary, the southern boundary of the excepted area being indicated by a purple line on the said map annexed to and forming part of these Byelaws.
