PROPOSALS FOR PRIMARY SCHOOL RESERVED PLACES FOR SCHOOL SESSION 2016/17

Purpose of Report:

This report seeks Executive Committee approval to apply a specific number of reserved places for named primary schools for session 2016/17 commencing in August 2016.

Recommendations:

The Executive Committee is asked to:

- note the successful implementation of the reserved places provisions in the past two school sessions;
- agree to continue with the existing factors for determining reserved places for session 2016/17 based on experience of the past two years;
- agree the list of schools and number of places to be reserved in each for school session 2016/17.

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1 Background

- 1.1 On 23 January 2014 the Executive Committee agreed in principle to utilise the reserved places provision within the placing request legislation in order to safeguard places for children living within a school's catchment area.
- 1.2 The reason for the utilisation of the reserved places provision within the Education (Scotland) Act 1991 as amended by the Standards in Schools Act 2000 is that after decades of a decreasing population across the city the population of Glasgow has started to increase. Over the next decade the primary age population is predicted to rise between 13% and 18%.
- 1.3 The use of reserved spaces is part of an approach to mange the education estate in a strategic manner and address capacity issues before they develop.
- 1.4 The allocation of spaces at any school in rank order is:
 - Catchment children
 - Reserved spaces
 - Placing requests
- 1.5 On 3 April 2014, the Executive Committee agreed a methodology and a range of factors for determining the level of reserved places in primary schools for school session 2014/15. In total the Executive Committee agreed to reserve a determined number of reserve places in 32 primary schools across the city to ensure that the Council could meet demand for catchment area places outwith the normal timetable for enrolment.
- 1.6 Recognising that session 2014/15 was the first year of utilising the reserved places provisions within the placing request legislation the Executive Committee noted that a further report would be submitted setting out proposals for reserved places for school session 2015/16 and thereafter 2016/17 taking account of the experiences and lessons learnt in the first two sessions of operation.

2 Experience of First 2 Years of Operation

- 2.1 Overall the introduction of reserved places has worked well, safeguarding places for catchment area children either enrolling after the normal enrolment timetable or safeguarding places for future years' demand based on forecasts of catchment area needs.
- 2.2 In October 2014 the Council's provision of reserved places was appealed to the Sheriff Court by a parent of a child wishing to attend a primary school in the West of the city by placing request that had been refused. The appeal was rejected, the Court finding in favour of the Council in that it had appropriately applied the provisions within legislation to safeguard places for future catchment area demand.

- 2.3 Whilst the headteachers of the schools allocated reserved places for school session 2014/15 appreciated the need for them, some concern was expressed that the numbers being set aside was too high and above what might be required. In practice this proved to be the case and consequently the factors used to determine the number of reserved places required was modified for session 2015/16.
- 2.4 The modified factors have worked well in session 2015/16 and it is proposed that these are used again in determining the number of reserved places for session 2016/17.

Note: As agreed for session 2015/16, there will be a maximum of 10 reserved places in any primary school for **session 2016/17**.

- 2.5 Based on the above factors for determining the primary schools and levels of reserved places to be allocated for session 2016/17 this will see an increase from 43 to 48 primary schools.
- 2.6 Details of the primary schools and the numbers of places to be reserved for school session 2016/17 are provided in the Appendix to this report.
