We went elsewhere as we had 105 family members attend. It's a great facility and deserves to be used in a better format. Org - Statutory	Broomlea PS		<p><i>Primary have made weekly use of Linn Park Adventure Playground to support pupils with complex additional support needs to develop play and communication skills.</i></p> <p><i>A similar pattern to this has been in place for at least 23 years. We firmly believe that the safe space the resource creates benefits our pupils' learning and contributes to developing strong pupil/staff relationships which are the basis of our teaching.</i></p> <p><i>In 2004 Broomlea Primary moved into Keppoch Campus alongside 2 mainstream primaries and a mainstream nursery. Part of the inter-school work that year was focused on play skills and was facilitated by The Yard. The sessions that were possible were both enjoyable and beneficial in prompting play across school boundaries. We would have loved to develop the work further but were frustrated by the geographical distance. The news that The Yard is looking to develop the work at Linn Park is exciting and should, we believe, benefit our pupils. Indeed, if there is any potential for outreach work we would love to have staff help us extend our play skills on site as well as at Linn Park. We continue to refer to the playpack issued by the Yard at the time of their work with us in 2005/2005 and would be excited to work with them again in 2019/20.</i></p>	
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
