


Public Holidays - Easter Weekend

Adapting to change story - David interviewed on Radio Scotland.



David Murray - Educational Psychologist, Glasgow Psychological Services at Education Services took part in a Radio Scotland interview on Tuesday 31 March. David spoke about a charitable support programme he is involved with called 'Seasons for Growth' and how Glasgow supports its parents, carers and children. The focus of David's interview was to help people understand the impact and process of adapting to loss and change; something that could help us all in these challenging times.

David and fellow Educational Psychologist Vicky Greenwood, provide Seasons for Growth 'Companion' training to our teaching and support staff across the city. There is now a network of 'Companions' who run support groups for young people experiencing significant loss and change. **David** said: "I wanted to reach out to the network of trainers, the Companions in Glasgow and our pupils who have accessed the programme. I told a story to listeners, using the seasonal metaphor, which I think can help everyone to adapt to the changes we are experiencing just now."

David added: "I hope the children and young people who have had access to the programme can highlight some of what they have learnt in all the virtual classrooms that our teachers are running. It can also support parents and carers."

"We're currently all experiencing significant changes and losses and we're also experiencing some of the very powerful and sometimes overwhelming feelings associated with loss or grief. The seasonal metaphor that I spoke about, can I think, help many people to better understand their feelings and emotions at this difficult time and I'd like to share it with all our staff."
