Hero teachers at Hazelwood School are thinking outside the box



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Hazelwood School in Glasgow's southside teaches children and young people with sensory impairment and complex learning needs.

With the school being closed due to the current crisis, staff considered how best to support their pupil's home learning and decided to resource and create bespoke sensory and craft boxes. The boxes contain a range of resources specific to each pupil's learning needs along with an 'ideas resource' for parents. Items in some of the boxes include sensory balls, soil and plant bulbs, massage oil, paint and moulding clay. This will allow an enjoyable and interactive learning experience at home which all the family can enjoy together. For pupils with visual impairments, sound balls and scented felt pens have even been included to make the boxes more engaging and every box contains a button switch with an audio recording of a special message from a member of that pupil's class.

Colette Gowing, Depute Headteacher said: "We thought our pupils would benefit more from bespoke craft and sensory boxes as well as some of the more formal academic learning tasks. Staff have worked hard to resource fun and appealing items to include. We have had a lot of interest from parents and hope to have our first batch of 30 completed and delivered by the end of next week. We really miss our pupils and teachers have been keeping in touch with them and their families via phone or video calls. The boxes are another way of supporting home learning and letting our pupils know we are thinking of them."
