#### **PMGC Newsletter 3**



#### Welcome back to our People Make Glasgow Communities newsletter!

The People Make Glasgow Communities programme has recently celebrated its first birthday. Since PMGC was created, we have received over 470 expressions of interest. Around 60% of these are for specific venues with a majority of these relating to Glasgow Life venues. The remaining 40% of enquiries relate to organisations who are looking for property in a specific area of the city with venues still to be identified. Over half of all enquiries are now closed. Most of the remaining enquiries are either in the Application (EOI) Stage or Initial Assessment Stage with interested parties working on a detailed proposal for the venue. 41 detailed proposals have been received for 35 venues and there are currently no venues with a live closing date.

### Proposals in the development phase

The following four People Make Glasgow Communities proposals are at a very advanced stage and were approved by the Contracts & Property in March to negotiate Heads of Terms with these organisations. All four organisations have now successfully entered the 'Development Stage' of the process.

**Langside Hall:** The Langside Hall Trust is aiming to repair, protect and enhance Langside Hall. Their long term goal is to provide a social programme managed by the Trust that will see subsidised cultural and wellbeing activities for the community, market the halls as an venue for commercial music, theatre, wedding venue etc, and provide community hires at the hall.

<u>Molendinar Community Centre</u>: St Paul's Youth Forum is intending on continuing to run Molendinar Community Centre as a community centre, including providing community lets, free healthy meals at the community café and using the IT suite as a basis for community learning. They also intend on using one of the rooms as a long term let for either a small business or as a let to Glasgow Kelvin College for community learning.

<u>Woodside Halls:</u> Community Central Halls is intending on providing community lets at Woodside Halls for the benefit of the local community, and existing users of the halls. They also plan to deliver cultural activities at the hall, by developing ties with the Cultural Quarter.

<u>Glasgow Club Drumoyne</u>: Park Villa Development Trust is intending to operate Glasgow Club Drumoyne and Pirie Park Pitches as a Community Hub from which they are planning to deliver services

that will build stronger, resilient, fairer and healthier communities in the Greater Govan area. This will include football and other sport related activities.

### Proposals in engagement phase

In addition to those mentioned in our last newsletter the organisations below are now also in the 'Engagement Phase' of the People Make Glasgow Communities process and will work up a detailed application which will include community engagement to ensure the proposal has support from the community.

### Case Study: Peterson Park Playing Fields & Pavilion

People Make Glasgow Communities received enquiries from a number of parties who were interested in becoming involved in the management of the Peterson Park Playing Fields & Pavilion. The team worked with each of these organisations and facilitated joint meetings to bring them together to explore partnership working. Through this facilitated process, three of the interested parties decided to work together and submitted a joint application for the venue. You can view their proposal on the PMGC webpage.

We are working closely with the Peterson Park Playing Fields Trust on the next steps in their journey. Areas where support is required have been identified and a working group has been formed to ensure that the organisations obtain the necessary steps to progress with their proposal. As the proposal involves the formation of a new Trust and a number of organisations coming together, it will take some time to mature and details to be worked through.

To ensure continued delivery of Shinty and Gaelic football play at this facility in the meantime, Glasgow Life and the PMGC team have agreed a short-term license to occupy with Mid-Argyll Shinty supported by Glasgow Life. This will allow the venue to continue to be used whilst the team are working on a long-term sustainable future of the facility with the new Trust.

### Working in partnership with The Circle Glasgow

People Make Glasgow Communities continues to work in partnership with The Circle and City Property as part of the Space for Growth scheme to help them provide a hub for charities, social enterprises, community groups and businesses at Westwood Business Centre, 69-71 Aberdalgie Road, Easterhouse (G34 9HJ).
