All council iPhones are due to have their device management software updated over the next few weeks and your phone is to be included in the next rollout. Device management is key to helping us effectively manage the corporate data on your council mobile device to help keep it secure.

All mobile devices will change from using Airwatch to using Microsoft Intune. This brings the benefit of

moving your email across to Microsoft Outlook meaning all your contacts, calendar and inbox settings are all in the one easy to access place.

Please ensure that prior to this happening you save all important messages and photos from your iphone to your work PC or they will be **lost and can not be recovered.**

#### **Hybrid Working Pilot Survey**

Our hybrid working pilot restarted in April and the last few months have meant that many office-based staff, whose role is suitable for hybrid working, have been splitting their time between home and office/field as part of the hybrid pilot.

One size doesn't fit all - managers, staff and teams have been working together to reach a balance of home and office working which suits the needs of our services and offers continued flexibility for a better work-life balance for staff.

It's now time to gather your views and opinions on what's worked well and what could be improved along with how hybrid working has supported your health and well-being.

Robert Anderson, Head of HR said: "Everyone's opinion matters, it is really important that we gather your views on the hybrid pilot so far. The pilot has created an opportunity to test new ways of working and tailor the arrangements to work best for individuals and the organisation. The hybrid arrangements need to continue to support our workforce and deliver services to our citizens and stakeholders. Robert continued: "It is more difficult for colleagues working in frontline roles to be offered the same degree of flexibility as those staff that are office based, however it is equally important that we continue to look at practical ways to create more flexible working options for everyone as we move forward".

### **George Square Development Consultation**

A final public engagement exercise with the people of Glasgow on the future design of George Square and the surrounding Avenues began on 11 July.

This final stage asks what people think about an initial sketch for George Square that has been developed following earlier engagement on what was wanted from the Square - Glasgow's foremost civic space - in terms of use and design.

The engagement will inform the final design of both the Square and around 2.5 kilometres of the surrounding streets in what is known as the George Square Area Project, aka Block C of the Avenues programme for Glasgow city centre, funded though the Glasgow City Region City Deal.

Councillor Susan Aitken, Leader of Glasgow City
Council, said: "Glasgow deserves a civic heart that
reflects the great, welcoming, vibrant city that it is - and
I'm pleased people from all over the city have taken
their opportunity to tell us what George Square means
to them and what they would like to see it become.
This final engagement will not only see their thoughts
on our city's most historic and loved public space take
shape; but also give Glaswegians a final chance to

influence the final design."

The final stage will feature online engagement, a popup display in George Square and a series of sessions with stakeholder groups.

The initial sketch for George Square provides a base for discussion - not a fully-developed option. During this final engagement, an exercise will follow that will consider a diversity of views to help deliver a concept design.

The redesign of George Square is being delivered alongside with the surrounding Avenues over two phases. The first phase will see George Square, John Street, Hanover and Miller Street, a section of North Hanover Street and Cochrane Street commencing construction in 2024 with completion due in 2026. The second phase of construction - at St Vincent Street, George Street, Dundas Street and Dundas Lane - will be completed in 2028.

The scheme is part of the wider £115million Avenues project - a network of new, attractive, accessible, safe, sustainable and easily-maintained routes throughout the city centre that are people-focused, encourage active travel and are more attractive to residents, workers, visitors and investors.

John McAslan + Partners were awarded the design contract for the project. Founded by Glasgow-born John McAslan in 1993, the practice has considerable experience in working in Scotland, including the recent refurbishment of the Burrell Collection in Glasgow and the National Galleries of Scotland's new Collection Facility in Edinburgh.
