SCREENING DETERMINATION FOR GLASGOW CITY COUNCIL'S FINAL DRAFT NORTH GLASGOW STRATEGIC DEVELOPMENT FRAMEWORK

This letter sets out the Council's determination under Section 8(1) of the Environmental Assessment (Scotland) Act 2005 on whether or not a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is required for the Council's final draft North Glasgow Strategic Development Framework (SDF).

SEA Screening Process

The screening process involved consulting the following Consultation Authorities on whether the final draft North Glasgow SDF is likely to have significant environmental effects:

- Historic Environment Scotland
- NatureScot
- Scottish Environment Protection Agency

In addition to consulting with the above bodies, the Council has also taken into account the criteria set out in Schedule 2 of the 2005 Act in determining whether or not the final draft North Glasgow SDF is likely to have significant environmental effects.

The Council wrote to the Consultation Authorities on the 26th of October 2022. The responses are summarised as follows:

We note that the SDF does not introduce any new policies, nor does it support any potential future development proposals that would be contrary to the policies of the adopted City Development Plan.
