Development Plan Scheme 2023 Consultation

Overview

The Development Plan Scheme provides key information to communities and stakeholders regarding how they can get involved in shaping the next Development Plan, City Development Plan 2.

Accordingly, Glasgow's City Development Plan team have created the Development Plan Scheme as a <u>'Storymap'</u> that forms the basis for future communication and interaction with the plan process.

Before drafting the Plan, the Council will be undertaking a range of early engagement activities which will involve the public and stakeholders in a number of ways, including the use of surveys and interactive activities online or in-person events. More information on the early engagement is found in the Development Plan Scheme and the survey at the end of the document.



Consultation

Consultation is underway for the Development Plan Scheme. We encourage all of those interested in shaping City Development Plan 2 to read the Development Plan Scheme and <u>take the survey.</u>

The results of the survey will be considered by the Council with the engagement strategy updated accordingly.

Local Heat and Energy Efficiency Strategy and Survey

You are invited to take part in the Public Consultation of Glasgow's first Local Heat and Energy Efficiency Strategy (LHEES).

The strategy is a key part of the work to reduce CO2 emissions and our dependency on fossil fuels.

It details what we have been doing to identify areas across Glasgow that are potentially suitable for district heating and those areas that require building fabric improvements, such as insulation. The consultation begins on 18 August and closes on 25 September and responses to this will help us finalise the strategy.

What do you do in your role?



My role is organising and supporting community groups, schools, businesses and individual Neighbourhood Improvement Volunteers who are our valuable community volunteers. Providing advice, litter picking equipment and helping with refuse uplift in accordance with Glasgow City Council's campaign People Make Glasgow Greener and encouraging individuals to take positive steps to improve their neighbourhoods. I help to build good relationships with communities, which is an important part of my role as well as empowering local communities and visiting and supporting community Hubs, which were created to tackle local litter issues. <u>Community Litter Picking Hubs</u> now have QR codes to record activity and are located across neighbourhoods in the city for all Glasgow citizens to access.

What is your favourite part of your role?

I do enjoy interaction and partnership with schools, local businesses and our volunteers. I like the variety of job tasks which also involves working with other partner agencies. The sense of helping and achieving a positive outcome in the community keeps me motivated and gives me a degree of satisfaction.

What are the biggest challenges within your role?

Greyfriars Biophilic Community Garden Launch

The Greyfriars Biophilic Community Garden, on Glasgow's historic High Street, was officially opened on 21 August 2023

The Garden, which features a strikingly vibrant collection of flowers, herbs, fruit and vegetables in 56 raised beds (three of which are accessible, where a chair or wheelchair can fit beneath) and surrounding areas, was created through a partnership between Glasgow City Council and local community groups from the Merchant City, High Street, Drygate and Trongate. The new growing space, located between the St Mungo mural and the Barony Hall, has transformed an underutilized open space into a community asset, managed by a committee of local people, offering food growing opportunities to local residents aged from their 20s to their 80s.

This project replaces and expands on the former Greyfriars Garden, which was set up in 2012 as part of the council's Stalled Spaces Initiative and which was always intended to be temporary with the Shuttle Street site earmarked for development.

Sandy Paterson, NRS Assistant Manager for Food Growing explained, 'The growing space is an exemplar of collaboration between our council departments and community based organisations working together for the greater benefit of the City and its residents. The project brought together colleagues from Housing Regeneration, Greenspace and Biodiversity, Planning, Economic Development, and City Centre Strategy teams to deliver a wonderful, empowering community asset.

NRS Project Officer, Alasdair McLeod, who manages Glasgow's Vacant and Derelict Land Fund added, 'We are always happy to see the regeneration and repurposing of vacant and derelict sites and this is a great inner city example of the impact that the Vacant and Derelict Land Fund can have in bringing these sites back into productive, community use.'

Veronica Low, Chair of the Greyfriars Biophilic Community Garden, said: "We are delighted to see the official opening of this Garden, where an underused green space has been turned into a site with an active growing community. We worked with the council to develop what has become many things, a sensory garden and a space to relax, meet your friends and grow. We are also looking to collaborate with other gardens, such as the one at the Provand's Lordship and the doctor's garden at the Royal Infirmary and we look forward to welcoming guests at Doors Open Day on 16 and 17 September.

The project was funded via the Vacant and Derelict Land Fund, City Centre Strategy and the Food Growing Strategy. Drone footage of the Greyfriars Biophilic Community Garden is available to view here.
