# Information Security Essentials Course 2024 on GOLD - Final Reminder

## **Real Living Wage Increase**

The Real Living Wage (formerly known as the Glasgow Living Wage) increases to £12.00 per hour from 1 April 2024.

We will apply this new hourly rate to the salaries of all Grade 1 employees from 1 April 2024 with the first payment received in 2 April 2024 pay.

This increase is in advance of the 2024 to 2025 pay settlement. When that is reached we will update all staff as soon as possible with the changes and any back dated pay at Grade 1 will be for any increase above the £12.00 per hour rate.

# Pollok Country Park Highland Cattle Show Success

Congratulations to our livestock team at Pollok Country Park who proved experts in their field at the Highland Cattle Society's Spring Show.

On Sunday 11 and Monday 12 February the Highland Cattle from Pollok Country Park attended the Biannual Show and sale of Highland cattle in Oban. We were awarded first place and best 3 year old female who then went on to be reserve supreme female champion. We also won best pair of females in the show and fourth place 4 year old female. Both went on to sell well and in the end, we were awarded 3 trophies.

## LGC Awards - NRS PRS Housing and Welfare Hub Shortlisted

The Council's Private Rented Sector Housing and Welfare Hub (PRS Hub), which is part of the Housing Strategy Group in NRS, has been shortlisted for the Local Government Calendar (LGC) Awards 2024 small team of the year.

Glasgow City Council is the only local authority in Scotland that provides services and works with families living in the city's Private Rented Sector (PRS) to prevent homelessness from occurring, improve the condition of their home and address issues relating to child poverty and health and wellbeing.

The PRS Hub provides the focus for a holistic and multi agency support service, which is achieved by the effective partnerships that are in place, clustered around the importance of an affordable and decent quality home. A key aim of the service is to place families on a stronger, more supported footing where they are able to self manage and move out of crisis.

A total of 1,607 households have been supported by the PRS Hub since March 2017 and the current homelessness prevention rate is 80%.

Housing is at the heart of the service but what the team does is much more encompassing, assessing entitlement to benefits, employability, childcare, tackling food and fuel poverty and delivering positive health and wellbeing outcomes.

Jennifer Sheddan (Head of Housing) said "NRS Housing is delighted and proud that the fantastic services provided by the PRS Hub have been recognised by the LGC Awards body. Preventing homelessness, improving the condition of housing and supporting families affected by the cost of living crisis are all key outcomes that the PRS Hub continues to deliver for our residents."

The winner of the award will be announced in June 2024 after the next round of judging takes place (scheduled for April 2024).

### Meet Your Colleagues

**Thomas McQuilkin - Bereavement Services** 

How long have you worked for the council?

I have worked in the council for 12 years, 10 of which in my current role.

What do you do in your role?



I have a very diverse role. My main responsibilities include the management of Bereavement Services staff and also the operation and maintenance of the city's 33 cemeteries and churchyards. I also handle approximately 900 burial services per year and I'm involved in co-ordinating the ongoing city wide memorial inspection programme. I sit on the communication champions group and recently have been assisting with some biodiversity and community engagement projects. An average day for me may include engaging with numerous stakeholders such as council employees from various departments, funeral directors, charities, contractors, faith groups or bereaved families. I am also currently in the middle of my final year of an Honour's Degree in Business Management at The University of Strathclyde, so I am kept busy!

#### What is your favourite part of your role?

Helping to drive the strategies of continuous improvement and innovation within the Bereavement Services industry, whether that be through the use of technology or through training and development. The industry has changed so much in the 12 years I have been involved and Glasgow City Council have been at the forefront of this, working with the Scottish Government, the Scottish Qualification Authority and the Scottish Bereavement Benchmarking Group to modernise and improve service delivery and safety in the industry.

#### What are the biggest challenges within your role?

My role has many challenges, many due to the sensitivities of the industry, as we provide a service during a difficult period for bereaved families. However perhaps the most challenging aspect of my role is tacking antisocial behaviour. Fly tipping and dog fouling are particularly prominent issues in our cemeteries and can be difficult to manage with our limited resources
