

**CARDONALD AREA PARTNERSHIP.**

Minutes of meeting held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2019 at City Chambers, Glasgow

**Present:** Councillor Elaine McSparran (Chair), Councillor Jim Kavanagh, and Councillor Alex Wilson, Glasgow City Council; Inspector Scott Simpson, Police Scotland; Colin Simpson, Glasgow Third Sector Interface Network; Karen Donaldson, Mossspark and Corkerhill Community Council; Margaret McIntyre, Southside Housing Association; and Nancy Loftus, South Cardonald and Crookston Community Council.

**Minutes of previous meeting approved.**

1 The minutes of 3<sup>rd</sup> September 2019 were submitted and approved.

**Glasgow Community Planning Partnership - Governance Framework - Membership update noted.**

2 There was submitted and noted a report by the Director of Governance and Solicitor to the Council providing an update on the membership of this Partnership, advising that

- (1) the Partnership and Development Team had been unable to secure representation from the Scottish Youth Parliament and would seek alternative representatives for this Partnership from Hillington , North Cardonald and Penilee Community Council;
- (2) the Partnership and Development Team would continue to communicate with Glasgow Life with regard to youth representation within the Ward;
- (3) Inspector Scott Simpson had been nominated as the representative for Police Scotland and had replaced Inspector Kevin Lammie; and
- (4) that the Cardonald Area Partnership had no current representative on the South Sector Partnership and that community representatives were requested to consider this and to discuss this further with the Partnership and Development Officer at the conclusion of the Area Partnership meeting.

### **Police Scotland – Ward update noted.**

**3** There was heard a report by Inspector Scott Simpson, Police Scotland, advising the Partnership of

- (1) the current progress that Police Scotland was making in relation to parking and traffic issues within the Ward, including parking tickets issued by Community Police Officers with Officers encouraging safe parking, particularly around the car free zones around school premises;
- (2) the work carried out by the Cardonald College Campus Officer in relation to bikes stolen from the College;
- (3) the contact assessment model in place to prioritise 999 and 101 calls to the appropriate agency; and
- (4) the recent Community Police Officer vacancies, one of which had been filled and would be working within the community from 14th January 2020.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report; and
- (b) heard that Inspector Simpson would confirm which Community Police Officer would attend which local Community Council meetings; and
- (c) thanked Inspector Scott for the work carried out by the Community Police Officers within the Ward who were always receptive and attended community events in the area when possible.

### **Scottish Fire and Rescue Service update – Consideration continued.**

**4** The Partnership agreed to continue consideration of an update on Ward issues by the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service to a future meeting of this Partnership.

### **Your Neighbourhood, Your Place – Activity report noted – Request to Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability.**

**5** There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods and Sustainability (NS) providing an overview of the community safety and environmental demands activity across the Ward area from April to September 2019, advising

- (1) of community safety issues and the environmental demands and trends experienced across the Ward as detailed in the appendix to the report; and

- (2) that there had been a number of requests submitted for Community Payback deployments across the Ward, including repainting the railings at Our Lady of the Rosary Primary School and de-littering and clearing a number of lanes.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the contents of the report;
- (b) raised concerns regarding
  - (i) the map size, context, abbreviations and how informative the percentage figures were;
  - (ii) issues reported via email which were not accurately recorded within the statistics; and
  - (iii) local businesses who had disposed of bulk waste in the public bins rather than using the larger commercial bins provided; and
- (c) requested information be provided to a future meeting of this Partnership advising of
  - (i) details of the call centre telephone numbers to report issues within the Ward;
  - (ii) the response times for the call centre;
  - (iii) a report with regard to missed bin collections within the area.

### **Cardonald Heritage Project update – Consideration continued.**

**6** The Partnership agreed to continue consideration of an update on the Cardonald Heritage Project by South West Arts and Music Project (SWAMP) to a future meeting of this Partnership.

### **Cardonald Community Council Reports - Verbal update noted.**

**7** There was heard and noted verbal reports from members of the Partnership on various matters regarding the Cardonald Ward –

- (1) M McIntyre, Southside Housing Association advised
  - (a) that the Halfway Community Park Development was running behind schedule due to problems with funding but hoped this would be completed by the end of January 2020; and
  - (b) of the road resurfacing, additional street lighting and bollards within the area;

- (2) N Loftus, South Cardonald and Crookston Community Council advised that work had been completed at Crookston Station and an event had been held to commemorate this with the installation of a plaque;
- (3) K Donaldson, Mosspark and Corkerhill Community Council advised
  - (a) of traffic and parking issues within the area; and
  - (b) that they were looking to arrange local events in 2020 to bring the community together and to involve all the Community Councils within the Ward;
- (4) C Simpson, Glasgow Third Sector Interface Network highlighted concerns regarding the change in funding from the Integrated Grant Fund to the Communities Glasgow Fund and how that could affect the Sector and other organisations across Glasgow, including the anxieties surrounding the groups who currently received less than £20k funding due to the new increased capped figure for organisations applying to the Fund.

#### **GCPP Governance Review of Sector and Area Partnerships noted.**

**8** There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities providing an update on the progress and next steps in relation to the review of Sector and Area Partnerships, advising that

- (1) phase 1 of the consultation comprised of the report which outlined the scope and rationale of the review, which was discussed by all 3 Sector and 23 Area Partnerships;
- (2) feedback from a desk based exercise, the GCPP Stakeholder survey in 2018 and the Sector and Area Partnerships meetings had been collated and condensed into a number of issues and themes which were informing phases 2 and 3 of the consultation;
- (3) phase 2 comprised of an online survey which was circulated to a wide variety of networks and organisations with a closing date of 31st October 2019;
- (4) phase 3 comprised of 6 focus groups of randomised stakeholders which had taken place from 11th to 15th November 2019 and whose feedback would be collated with all other information gathered and developed into draft recommendations on the future role of the Sector and Area Partnerships by the end of November 2019;
- (5) an event would be held on 4th December 2019 in the City Chambers to brief current members of the Sector and Area Partnerships on these draft recommendations and seek further feedback; and

- (6) final recommendations would be developed and a report submitted to the GCPP Strategic Partnership for its consideration.

After consideration, the Partnership noted

- (a) the report and progress to date;
- (b) that an event would be held on Wednesday 4th December 2019 to brief Sector and Area Partnership members on draft recommendations following the review; and
- (c) highlighted concerns that the Community representatives within the Ward had not received notification to advise them of the meeting on 4th December 2019.

### **2019/20 Area Budget – Applications for funding noted etc.**

**9** There was submitted a report by the Director of Community Empowerment and Equalities regarding the Area Budget 2019/20, advising

- (1) that Cardonald Area Partnership's Area Budget allocation for 2019/20 was £65,554.72; and
- (2) of the applications for funding from the Area Budget 2019/20.

After consideration, the Partnership

- (a) noted the report and that there had been 2 applications dealt with under delegated functions, as detailed in the report; and
- (b) dealt with the applications for funding as follows, the grant awards being subject to the conditions detailed in the report:-
