

Glasgow City Primary Care Improvement Plan noted.

5 There was submitted and noted a report by the Chief Officer, Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership (HSCP) regarding its Primary Care Improvement Plan (PCIP), advising

- (1) that the Scottish Government had introduced a new 3-year contract, with the support of General Practitioners (GPs), which came into force in April 2018 in response to growing pressures within the primary care sector with the aim of enabling GPs to operate as expert medical generalists by diverting work that could best be done by others to create more capacity for GPs to care for people with complex needs and to operate as senior clinical leaders of extended multi-disciplinary teams;
- (2) that the PCIP for Glasgow was a joint plan between Glasgow City Integration Joint Board (IJB) and the GP sub-committee which had been approved by both organisations respectively, on 31st July and 19th September 2018;
- (3) of the principal elements of the new contract;
- (4) that a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU), covering the period from 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2021, to support the new contract had been signed by the Scottish Government, the British Medical Association, Integration Authorities and NHS Boards and that the MoU committed IJBs to develop, for each Health and Social Care Partnership, a PCIP in collaboration with GPs and other stakeholders; and
- (5) that the key priorities for the PCIP were prescribed by the MoU and of the communication and engagement process undertaken with various stakeholders to inform the preparation of the plan, as detailed in the report.
