The Supply and Delivery of Four - Wheeled Bins

Tender Reference :- GCC005677CPU

Purpose of Report:

To submit details of the tenders received for the supply and delivery of four-wheeled bins and recommend acceptance of the most economically advantageous tender as detailed in this report.

1 Background and Tender

- 1.1 Glasgow City Council's ("the council's") annual budget for the supply and delivery of four-wheeled bins is £275,182.
- 1.2 The contract is for the supply and delivery of four-wheeled bins in a range of sizes. These will be distributed to tenement flats for domestic waste and recycling, utilised by the council for on-street waste and recycling requirements and also supplied to commercial premises for waste and recycling. The provision of these bins aims to increase the amount and quality of recycling, reduce the amount of waste sent for further treatment or landfill, improve the backcourt environment through better waste containment and reduce instances of spillages, litter and pests.
- 1.3 A commodity team consisting of stakeholders from Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability (NRS) and the Corporate Procurement Unit (CPU) was formed to develop the sourcing strategy and deliver a new contract.
- 1.4 In line with the efficiency and effectiveness aim of the Council's Corporate Procurement and Commercial Improvement Strategy 2018-2022, located at <https://www.glasgow.gov.uk/CHttpHandler.ashx?id=42092&p=0>, (which promotes consideration of National and Collaborative Frameworks), it was agreed that a mini-competition process under Lot 2 - 4 Wheeled Bins of Scotland Excel's (SXL) framework for the Supply and Delivery of Recycle and Refuse Containers (Framework), reference 07-21, would be the most appropriate method to deliver this contract.
- 1.5 The duration of the contract is for a period of 42 months, with an option to extend for a further period of up to 12 months, commencing December 2022 to June 2027, if the extension is taken. The contract extends beyond the end date of the SXL Framework, December 2026, and this will allow the CPU to determine if the new SXL Framework will provide best value and if the extension option should be taken.
- 1.6 The Purchase to pay route is via Servitor. This system is also used by NRS to support the stock control of specific items.
- 1.7 The contract will be utilised by NRS.

2 Evaluation

- 2.1 All 7 suppliers appointed to Lot 2 of SXL's Framework were invited to submit a tender bid. 2 suppliers submitted a bid. Out of the remaining 5 suppliers which did not submit a bid, 4 advised that they are unable to meet the specification and 1 did not reply.
- 2.2 The award evaluation was based on the following criteria and weightings:

2.3 The evaluation of award scoring and estimated annual award value of the supplier which has been recommended for award is shown in the table below: -

2.4 The contract value is based on an assumed number of bins purchased annually at the fixed rate per unit provided in the recommended supplier's tender submission.

2.5 A summary of the unsuccessful tender evaluation results can be found at Appendix A.

2.6 NRS will monitor the supplier's day to day operational performance. Overall contract and performance will be managed by the CPU.

3 Policy and Resource Implications

Resource Implications:

Financial:

The estimated value is £254,930 per annum, as set out in paragraph 2.3, totaling £1,147,185 over the 54 months duration of the contract (including the extension). This will be met by NRS's revenue budget.

A price increase amounting to £15,437 (6%) per annum has been incurred when compared to the benchmarked spend. However, the tendered prices represent a significant discount from the current SXL framework pricing.

Legal:
