

Education Services review of values, vision and priorities - Looking forward update noted etc.

3 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Education Services regarding Education Services' review of vision, values and priorities and engagement of heads, staff, parents / carers and children and young people in the process, advising that

- (1) through support by the refreshed Scottish Attainment Challenge, Glasgow continued to work to support education recovery, accelerate progress towards closing the attainment gap and through a range of Glasgow Improvement Challenges to improve outcomes for children and young people impacted by poverty, with a focus on tackling gaps in children's and young people's outcomes associated with relative poverty;
- (2) Education Services had initiated a conversation to review and plan the next phase of its journey in Glasgow, which would be centred within the context of the new Council plan, connecting with the wider council family and external stakeholders;
- (3) following 2 'Looking Forward' conferences which had been facilitated by the Education Services Directorate in May 2022, summary output had been collated and the values which were most commonly identified, namely priorities for delivery and measures of impact, would form the basis of further work to set the direction for Education Services as it moved forward;
- (4) as a result of the sessions with heads of service and the central team, draft documents would be prepared for further engagement and consultation involving children and young people, parents / carers, the wider staff group and partners before a final version was brought back to a future meeting for consideration.

After consideration, the committee noted

- (a) the update; and
- (b) Education Services' ambitions for continued engagement to support ongoing improvement.
