

NEIGHBOURHOODS, HOUSING AND PUBLIC REALM CITY POLICY COMMITTEE'S MINUTES.

By video conference, 27th September 2022.

Neighbourhoods, Housing and Public Realm City Policy Committee.

Development of City Development Plan Scheme 2022/23 noted.

1 There was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability regarding the City Development Plan Scheme 2022/23, advising

- (1) that a new Planning Act had been introduced in 2019 which altered the position on many aspects of the various planning procedures including the preparation of a new City Development Plan and as part of implementing that Act, the Scottish Government had been preparing a 4th National Planning Framework (NPF4);
- (2) that the NPF4 had been published in a draft consultation form in November 2021, followed by new draft consultation Local Development Plan (LDP) regulations and guidance in December 2021 and the publication of the NPF4 and LDP had enabled the Council to create an outline timeline for the next City Development Plan, which would be known as the Local Development Plan in Glasgow;
- (3) that the Council had developed a storymap Development Plan Scheme for 2022/23, as detailed in an Appendix to the report;
- (4) that the Development Plan Scheme was the primary way that the Development Plan Team, Neighbourhoods and Regeneration Services communicated its work programme internally and externally and it was also an important tool that outlined opportunities for collaboration with stakeholders, allowing alignment of work programmes to support joined-up place investment and activity, to reflect the current position of national

planning, the Development Plan Scheme bridged existing legislative requirements;

- (5) that the previous Development Plan Scheme was published in July 2020 and the Development Plan Scheme 2022/23 shares some of the key messages from the draft LDP guidance which would directly influence the preparation of the next development plan for Glasgow and increased emphasis would be made to link planning policy and process with place based outcomes that reflected the Council's strategic objectives;
- (6) that the draft LDP guidance had placed a renewed emphasis on early public engagement, with the intention of encouraging evidence gathering that bridges traditional plan making, with a more participatory and collaborative process and the 2019 Planning Act had created a statutory duty for planning authorities to engage with specific groups of society including children and young people and an engagement strategy would be developed;
- (7) of the next steps in the Development Plan Scheme; and
- (8) that in addition to the work programme for the Development Plan Scheme, the Planning Service intended to bring forward other policy related work, as detailed in the report.

After consideration, the committee noted

- (a) the purpose, content and timeline in the updated Development Plan Scheme; and
- (b) the other planning policy work priorities.
