

Active Travel infrastructure delivery – Update noted.

4 With reference to the minutes of the City Administration Committee of 24th February 2022 (Print 7, page 503) approving Glasgow’s Active Travel Strategy 2022-31, there was submitted a report by the Executive Director of Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability regarding progress made with various active travel infrastructure projects being delivered this financial year, advising

- (1) that Neighbourhoods, Regeneration and Sustainability (NRS) were currently leading in the delivery of a significant number of active travel projects aligned to the Council’s strategic objectives as set out in the Glasgow Transport Strategy Policy Framework;
- (2) in further detail of the 4 strategic transport outcomes and the relevant policies following on from Glasgow’s Public Conversation on the future of the city’s transport;
- (3) in further detail of the Liveable Neighbourhoods (LN) Programme; and
- (4) of the current active travel projects which would reduce unsustainable travel across the city and provided enhanced opportunities to increase the number of journeys made on foot or by cycle thereby reducing carbon emissions and the environmental impact of transport as detailed in the report.

After consideration, the committee noted

- (a) the report; and
- (b) the progress made on active travel infrastructure projects.
