



Annual economic impact of festivals & events attributed to Gaelic is £7.2million







Overall, over 700 FTE jobs attributed to Gaelic

Gaelic and Wellbeing

A survey of individuals about the impact of Gaelic on Wellbeing found...

For those in work, **50%** say Gaelic is critical or important for their employment situation





For those who volunteer, **53%** say Gaelic is critical or important to their volunteering role
