Citizens Asked to Step Forward to Volunteer for Glasgow 850

Volunteers of all ages and backgrounds are being sought to support the celebrations around Glasgow 850's yearlong programme throughout 2025.

The Glasgow 850 Volunteer and Employability programme will offer Glaswegians a unique opportunity to play a key part in the city's birthday year, with roles to support the smooth running of its main events and local community projects.



In a break from the conventional volunteer programmes that recruits and trains people for specific roles, as part of a one-time event, the Glasgow 850 scheme will ask people to register to hear about a rolling programme of volunteer and learning opportunities, throughout the anniversary year.

Developed in conjunction with Volunteer Glasgow, this approach to volunteering creates an inclusive and rewarding experience for participants. It allows them to engage in a range of activities at their own pace, offering greater flexibility and choice than traditional volunteer schemes.

In registering their interest, volunteers will have the chance to be at the heart of Glasgow's 850 celebrations by supporting the signature activities including a three day music event; Clyde Chorus, People's Palace pop-up exhibition and Taste the Place food trail.

In addition to these flagship events, there will be a chance for volunteers to get involved in events run by Glasgow 850 Festival Fund recipients and locally based roles with community organisations, ensuring that participants can contribute in ways that best suit their interests and availability.

Susanne Millar and George Gillespie Visit the MACC

For the last two years, Glasgow City Council have led on the management of a Multi Agency Coordination Centre (MACC) aimed at tackling unauthorised bonfires and their associated problems across Glasgow.

On Monday 4 and Tuesday 5 November, this new approach brings colleagues from Operations, Trading Standards, Community Safety, Police Scotland and the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service under one roof, situated within the Glasgow Operation Centre (GOC) in Eastgate. This streamlined approach allows for better communication across agencies and an effective, coordinated response, helping to make bonfire night safer for everyone.

For the two days the operational unit is live, the teams assess and prioritise intelligence on bonfires or accumulated materials. This intelligence is gathered through different methods, from using the Council's CCTV estate to view where the bonfires are being built, using data and knowledge from Parks and Cleansing staff of previous hot spots as well as reports from concerned members of the public. This approach focuses on efficient detection and prevention. Once detected all partners are there to address it; Community Safety provide the CCTV assets for live information, Operational staff respond to the reports to carry out uplift of the materials while Police Scotland provide support and safety to the staff on the ground.



Work doesn't just start in November, with Council staff routinely monitoring and inspecting hotspots for potential build up of materials. Proactively dealing with accumulation and monitoring what's coming through, Parks and Cleansing massively bolster the strength of the MACC by lightening the load and gathering information that can then be used in a live environment, informing the safest and most effective approach to a situation.

The MACC is a success because it brings a vast array of intelligence and experience into one place, making communication quicker and clearer. Everyone is looking at the same data, allowing teams to respond in unison. Darren Lambie, a group manager for Community Safety led on the project, helping to prioritise actions over the two days while coordinating risk assessments with our partners in the Police and Fire services. Having the right people in place on the frontline and in the operational centre helped our colleagues safely clear fourteen unauthorised bonfires across the city.

George Gillespie, Executive Director of NRS expressed his admiration for the project stating:

"It was a pleasure to visit the MACC along with the Chief Executive and see all the planning and hard work that goes into keeping citizens safe over the bonfire period. The collaboration across our services, from the intel provided by colleagues and partners to the challenging groundwork undertaken by Operational staff, in conjunction with our partners in the Emergency Services is key to keeping our city safe. It's great to see our colleagues within NRS share our assets and insights so effectively and make this project such a success, benefitting all our communities."

Constantly seeking to improve, there will be a formal debrief taking place before the New Year between the Council, Police Scotland and Fire services to review the lessons learned for next year and continually assess our practises to improve year on year. One lesson which is clear is that bringing the correct people together and sharing our skills and assets makes it safer for the public to enjoy these occasions and our colleagues to operate on the ground, with clear communication and close collaboration being at the core of its success.

NRS at Doors Open Day 2024

For Doors Open Day (DOD) Glasgow 2024, Mandy Fallens, a senior architect in Property and Consultancy Services, along with conservation accredited architect Fiona Sinclair, sought permission from Glasgow City Council to include St Vincent Street Church in the programme of buildings. This very popular event attracted over 300 visitors and gained an award from the DOD organisers owing to the special nature of the building and the effort made to permit the visits. The event facilitated a rare opportunity to see inside the last surviving intact church by world renowned architect, Alexander "Greek" Thomson.

Built in 1859, St Vincent Street Church is Alexander Thomson's masterpiece and only intact surviving church after Queens Park was destroyed by bombing in 1943 and Caledonia Road is a ruin having been burnt out in 1965. Alexander 'Greek' Thomson was one of the two great architects of international stature produced by Victorian Glasgow.

The building was bought by GCC in 1960 and was let as a church until 2021. The open event allowed visitors access to one of the finest remaining classical and romantic churches to view the building, including the highly decorative interior and the distinctive clock tower which is a prominent feature on the city's skyline.

We worked in collaboration with The Thomson Society and City Property to open the building for the event. We also displayed information about the building and the architect for visitors and provided tours on the day which were very well received.

The Thomson Society was founded in 1991, further information on the society can be found on their <u>website</u>.

Thanks go to Philip Houston, Anna McEwan and Chloe MacKinnon who helped with setting up the event and ran tours on the day. Ken Owler and Barry Mallon from City Property also helped to make the building safe and available for the visitors who enjoyed the tours.

The DOD organisers mentioned that they received many positive comments in the festival feedback from the participants who visited, expressing their fondness for the building and the informative tours.

Huge New Community Greenspace to be Created

Derelict Glasgow land is be transformed into a lush new community greenspace measuring almost 15 hectares.

Glasgow City Council is to create a new woodland in Cadder as part of the city's Tree Plan. The vacant site at Hapland Road and Cathkin Quarry will become a multifunctional community asset. It will increase wildlife habitat, create recreational and outdoor learning spaces and boost the city's green canopy.

A tree nursery will also be established in the North East of the city to grow native saplings for planting across Glasgow while providing training and employment opportunities via a social enterprise. Vacant and Derelict Land funding has been secured for the first phase of the project and a working group has been created to progress the idea.

The exciting new projects were highlighted in an update on the city's Tree Plan presented to the council's Net Zero committee.

The committee also heard that the council had planted over 24,000 trees across the city in 2023/24, exceeding the target for the year. This planting was carried out with the help of volunteers, schools, city businesses and partners including The Conservation Trust, Green Action Trust and Clyde Climate Forest.

Trees with smaller leaves, such as Birch, Rowan and Hornbeam, are also being planted in city streets to reduce the risk of fallen leaves blocking drains. (Evergreen trees are less suited to busy road verges, as they are more susceptible to wind damage).

Members of the public can also suggest locations for tree planting, volunteer to help with planting or buy a commemorative tree via the council's Tree Portal. It can be found <u>here</u>.

Plans are also in the pipeline to enable city residents to sponsor a tree in their own street or a favourite city location.

Not only did Melissa and the team win numerous awards in Oban but they were also successful at the Stars of the Future show in early November as one of their young bulls, Alistair of Pollok, won overall junior Highland Champion.

Melissa said 'To be recognised on a national scale is a massive achievement for the fold and shows that the hard work and dedication put into the cattle by Glasgow City Council is paying off.'
